Vice President's Report by Danny Powers



On Wednesday, July 31st, the International UAW Executive Board voted to endorse Kamala Harris for President of the United States. Her historic candidacy builds on the Biden-Harris administration's proven track record of standing with the UAW and delivering major gains for the working class. That being said, I am not telling anyone how to vote, but I would ask you to make sure you are registered and VOTE!

Article 41 Section 3 of our UAW International Constitution states; "It shall be the duty of each member to participate in all local, state, provincial, and federal elections through registration and balloting".

As your Constitution and Bylaws Chairman, I want to discuss Bylaws changes and amendments. Your Constitution and Bylaws Committee is working diligently to update and make positive changes to ensure our membership is moving forward. The following outlines the process for amending our Bylaws. Please refer to our Local Union Bylaws for exact verbiage.

To amend a bylaw, you must present a motion in writing setting forth the amendments sought to a General Membership meeting. This written motion must be presented to the Recording Secretary in time to appear as an agenda item at the General Membership Meeting. A copy of the proposed changes must be available and distributed at the meeting. The motion shall be read. If rejected, no further action is necessary. If approved by 2/3 vote of the members present at this 1st reading, the proposed change will be referred to the Committee

which will report to the succeeding General Membership Meeting the Agenda of which will contain a notice of the particular bylaws amendment that will be considered. If approved by 2/3 of the Membership present and voting at this meeting, the amendment shall be considered adopted by the Membership.

Notwithstanding the forgoing, the Local Bylaws may also be amended by unanimous action of the Membership present at the 1st meeting where they are presented without the necessity of being referred back to a subsequent Membership Meeting. After the Membership has approved all changes, these newly adopted amendments must be sent to the International Union for approval. All Local Bylaws are subordinate to the International Constitution.

Lastly, I would like to give a big shout out to all the volunteers and everyone who came out to enjoy our annual Family Day. Thank You.

On July 15, 2024 the company hired 16 TFT's in the plant. In addition, they have also hired 5 new Electricians. The Committee and I want to say Congratulations and Welcome to our 863 Family! Unfortunately, we only have a limited supply of National Agreements left, but we have plenty of Local Agreements left. I want to congratulate the 8 new Apprentices who will be starting the Apprentice Program here in a couple weeks. Good Luck to you all! Also, Congratulations to Sean McKinney and Tony Napier for completing their Electrician Apprentice Program, and Ryan Wolters for completing his Pipefitter Apprentice Program. Great Job!

We will have some help for our retirees to make sure they have easy access to the vaccinations they want or need. (See in the Retirees Only section of this letter)

Active Members Only:

New Disability Provider: Sedgwick 1-844-601-4629 or go online at www.mySedgwick.com/Ford-Unicare is no longer the provider for our Disability Benefits for Active Employees as of 3/31/2024. Sedgwick took over on 4/1/2024. Please remember to contact Sedgwick as soon as possible if you are going to be going on a medical leave. There have been some growing pains with the transfer from Unicare to Sedgwick, but I can only hope it continues to get easier for our members as time goes on and everyone learns the new processes.

New Hires: Please make sure that you have contacted the National Employee Service Center to select your insurance preferences and add any dependents. Make sure you complete your Dependent Verification when it is requested.

Retirees Only:

Please be sure to plan to attend the September 2024 Retiree meeting. The UAW Medical Benefits Trust

(VEBA) will be coming to the meeting to go over the new plan changes for 2025.

OCTOBER VACCINE CLINIC:

At the October Retiree meeting we

will be offering Vaccinations for the Retirees and their covered dependents. YOU MUST SIGN UP IN
ADVANCE AT THE LOCAL FOR THE VACCINES. We will provide more information at the September retiree meeting. There will be sign up sheets at the local for you to choose from the vaccines provided. Vaccines provied will be COVID and FLU for for retirees and their covered dependents. You will need to bring your insurance card at the time of service. Vaccine Clinic Date:

October 1, 2024 Times: TBD Retirees & Dependents ONLY: MUST SIGN UP IN ADVANCE

(if you do not sign up in advance and there are not enough left over vaccines you may not be able to get vaccinated that day and you would have to wait until all members that DID sign up have been taken care of so, please be sure to sign up)

IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

I have mentioned this time and time again, when you are going for Physical Therapy and you have National PPO BCBS plan you MUST go in NETWORK with Theramatrix (see the back of your card) Go to the website to find in network locations at www.theramatrix.com or call the number on the back of your card. You will be paying out of pocket if you go out of network. It is imperative that you stay in network with all your coverages. It is your responsibility to make sure you are going to an IN-NETWORK provider. If you have any doubts, go to the websites, and verify or call the number on the back of your cards.


Lets Talk About It...




