Brothers and Sisters of Local 863,

From the entire 863 Committee, we hope everyone's families are doing well as we start this Autumn season. First off, I want to congratulate Colson Napier (Big Country) for recently being recommended locally and appointed by the International UAW as our new ERC Coordinator for 3rd shift. Country has done a great job of servicing the membership as a District Committeeman and Bargaining Committeeman since 2014. He is looking forward to continuing servicing this membership in the ERC role. He will be in training for a couple weeks before he transitions to 3rd shift. This will be a great resource for 3rd shift to help assist in our teams. Larry Miller will be filling in for Country until there is a Bargaining Election.

On rolls right now, we have 1426 production, 48 of those are TFT's and 361 skilled trades, 53 of those are apprentices for a total of 1787 members. The Company is currently interviewing for the 2 Toolmakers, 1 Pipefitter, 1 HVAC and remaining Electrician openings. These openings should all be filled here in the next couple of weeks. Additionally, we continue to meet with the Company lobbying for more Skilled Trades help. As far as production hiring, nothing is scheduled currently. The Company is still trying to understand what the volumes are looking like for the 8F and HF programs and when the volume takes off before they decide to hire more people. I will let everyone know once this happens.

New Disability Provider: Sedgwick - 1-844-601-4629 or go online at www.mvSedgwick.com/Ford - so far there have been some issues with Sedgwick that I am seeing such as Unicare faxing your paperwork to your doctor automatically if they had the information. Now, YOU must tell Sedgwick to fax it to your doctor andconfirm that your doctor received it, otherwise Sedgwick will email or snail-mail you the packet to hand deliver to your doctor. It is imperative that you keep up with your paperwork process making sure that the paperwork is received by your doctor, sent back to Sedgwick, and contains ALL the correct information. If you do not keep up with the paperwork you could receive a 5-day quit and the process of termination can begin. IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBIL-ITY TO MAKE SURE THAT PAPERWORK GETS COMPLETED, do not let it cost you

Retired Members Only:

Retirees be sure to avoid the phone calls from solicitors trying to switch your MEDICARE plan. Hang-up! Do not engage as they can easily talk you right into changing your plan which will mess up your UAW benefits very quickly. Do not call the numbers on the television to inquire about another plan. You have the best benefits out there so there is no need to change. Also, make sure you are using your OTC \$200 before the end of the year. Call the RHCC if you have lost or misplaced your card at 1-866-637-7555.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

I have mentioned this time and time again, when you are going for Physical Therapy and you have National PPO BCBS plan you MUST go in NETWORK with Theramatrix (see the back of your card) Go to the website to find in network locations at www.theramatrix.com or call the number on the back of your card. You will be paying out of pocket if you go out of network. It is imperative that you stay in network with all your coverages. It is your responsibility to make sure you are going to an IN-NETWORK provider. If you have any doubts, go to the websites, and verify or call the number of the back of your cards.

Oct. 30-31 from 7:30am-7:30pm
Nov. 1 from 7:30am-7:30pm

You may also fill out and submit an absentee application to get your ballot in the mail. Applications are currently being accepted until 8:30pm on October 29th.




