

Brothers and Sisters,

It is hard to believe that the year is coming to an end already. Overall, 2024 has been a pretty good year. We have seen a lot of changes in the plant this year with around 200 of our members retiring and taking buyout packages and hiring around 200 new members. As we end 2024 and move into 2025, we continue to see predictions that our schedules and volumes will remain strong throughout the year.

I want to congratulate Jason Romine for winning the special Bargaining election that took place on November 19, 2024. Jason will be a great addition to the Bargaining Team, and I know he will do a great job. I also want to thank All the candidates that chose to run in the election as well. It takes a lot of courage to put yourselves out there and run for the position and it should not go unnoticed.

On November 12, 2024, the company hired 2 Toolmakers and 1 Pipefitter. Tyler Leach who was currently working in production was hired for the Tool maker position along with Jacob Baucom from the outside. The Pipefitter hire is Luke Louderback who is also from the outside. I would like to welcome them all to Local 863. In addition, the company is still planning on bringing in 1 for HVAC which will start on December 9, 2024 and another pipefitter and another electrician which will most likely start at the beginning of next year.

Schedules and volumes currently are: 10R- 3044 /day, 6R140-365/day, 6F/ 8F-430-600/ day depending on model,

HF- 450-550/day depending on model, and 6R80 stays at 425/day.

Currently on rolls we have 1422 production (48 TFT's), 363 skilled (53 apprentices) for a total of 1785 members.



It has been a busy year with the 220 retirements, the 207 new hires or transitions from temporary to fulltime employment, and all the other wonderful blessings that life gives us when we least expect them. Mine was a new grandson. I want to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. I pray that 2025 will hold many wonderful things for each one of us.

Active Employees: There are not a lot of changes happening right now for our Active members. We are all settling in with the new disability provider, Sedgwick. Please make sure you are contacting them if you are going to be off longer than 3 days to report your illness or hospitalization. Stay on top of your paperwork to make sure it gets in the hands of your doctor's office and completed and returned within the 14-day conditional medical leave period. You are responsible to make sure Sedgwick gets your paperwork within the 14-day period or you could receive a 5-day quit notice. Do not let that happen! If you are incapacitated, please make sure someone in your family knows to reach out to the UAW office 513-782-7625 or to the UAW Benefit office 513-782-7626 for us to assist. We want to make sure you are protected while you are off with a medical condition. See Sedgwick contact information below: Sedgwick -Phone: 1-844-601-4629 www.mysedgwick.com/ford (create your own account at this site and you can open your own claim)

<u>Retirees</u>: Those of you that are eligible (retired prior to 9/23/2023)

will be receiving your 2nd installment of \$500 this December. The remaining payments will be made December 2025, December 2026, and December 2027 all in the amount of \$500. Surviving spouses are also eligible for the retiree bonus.

DO NOT call the numbers on the television to get new Medicare plans, **DO NOT call & DO NOT answer** calls from people trying to convince you to switch plans. Hang up on them or tell them you are not interested and tell them not to call back. You have one of the best plans out there and the UAW Medical Benefits Trust provides our retirees with excellent benefits and service.

OTC Benefits for 2024 expire December 31, 2024 - \$200 per member – make sure you KEEP YOUR CARD to get it reloaded in January 2025 with the new amount of \$350 per member. This is an outstanding benefit. Please make sure you are taking full advantage of these monies. You can go to CVS, Walgreens, and other facilities to use this card immediately without having to place an order online. If you have lost your card, call OTC immediately at 1-844-487-2770 – they are easy to reach and quick to help.


IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

I have mentioned this time and time again, when you are going for Physical Therapy and you have National PPO BCBS plan you MUST go in NETWORK with Theramatrix (see the back of your card). Go to the website to find in network locations at www.theramatrix.com or call the number on the back of your card. You will be paying out of pocket if you go out of network. It is imperative that you stay in network with all your coverages. It is your responsibility to make sure you are going to an IN-NETWORK provider. If you have any doubts, go to the websites, and verify or call the number on the back of your cards.



Retirees and surviving spouses who are eligible (retired prior to 9/23/2023) will receive the UAW negotiated Christmas Bonus some time in December. Retirements after 9/23/2023 are not eligible for the Christmas Bonus.

5. UAW Local 863 Headquarters 1-513-563-1252

Obituary in the Transmitter and a Bible in Memory of the Employee or Retiree whom passed.

Survivor Benefits processing can take 60-180 days to be completed. Continue to use current insurance cards until process is complete.


