This letter serves as the official call to the UAW Region 2B Fall School, which will be held September 14–19, 2025, at the UAW Family Education Center in Onaway, Michigan.

This new program reflects our Region's continued commitment to education, leadership development, and lifelong learning within our union. This conference will be a powerful opportunity for members to build knowledge, sharpen skills, and strengthen solidarity. Whether you are a seasoned leader, an emerging activist, or a member eager to better understand your union, there is a place for you in this program.

Workshop tracks will be available for members at all levels of experience. Course offerings will focus on leadership development, foundational union knowledge and more. Each workshop is designed to equip our members with tools to build stronger locals and a more powerful labor movement.

Delegates should plan to arrive at the Center between 3:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. on Sunday and depart after breakfast on Friday.

ELIGIBILITY TO ATTEND

This conference is open to UAW members in good standing, as approved by their local union.

Attendance is mandatory at all sessions and will be taken daily. Local unions sending delegates are responsible for payment of all lost time.

REGISTRATION

Local unions must register their delegates no later than August 22, 2025.

The \$680 conference registration fee must be paid using ACH in LUIS. This fee covers lodging, meals, and materials. It is non-refundable. Funds will not be withdrawn until the region approves the delegates after registration closes.

Delegates must be registered by an officer or authorized clerical designee. Delegates should not complete their own registration. Refer to the Local Union Process document for full registration instructions.

Delegates should arrive to the Family Education Center between 3:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, September 14, allowing enough time to attend conference registration on arrival, where they will receive a detailed program agenda. These cannot be guaranteed. Attendance is mandatory at all sessions and is taken daily. Local Unions or Units sending delegates will be responsible for payment of all lost time.

TRAVEL INFORMATION

All delegates must arrive between 3:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. ET on Sunday, September 14 and remain until adjournment at 9:00 a.m. ET on Friday, September 19.

Delegates will be dismissed to travel home on Friday, September 19. Early departures must be approved by the local union President by notifying Region 2B Education Representative Amy Richardson at arichardson@uaw.net. Room fees will not be refunded for early departures.

Passenger Vehicle Policy: Vehicles must be union-made (VIN beginning with 1, 2, 4 or 5) to park inside the Center. Others may park in an adjacent lot.
