

From the entire Local 863 Committee, we hope everyone's families are doing well as we start this Autumn season.

On rolls right now, we have 1460 production (96 TFT's), Skilled 362 (54 apprentices), for a total of 1822. Our schedules and volumes are currently at- 10r140/10r80- 3044/day and is still scheduled 2 shifts every weekend for the remainder of the year, 6r140- 371/day, 8F57-900/day, HF55 currently@569/day then in January increases to 700/day., 6R80- 540/day with the fronts and rings balancing out in December, then rears are scheduled to balance out in February.

The company hired 27 new TFT's on 9-29-25. I would like to take the time to congratulate and welcome them to our 863 family. With that, the committee and I have been in discussions about converting some of our existing TFT's to full-time status. I am proud to report that they have agreed to convert 26 members to full-time status! This will convert the entire 6-2-25 class! Once we get the official notice, we will have a meeting with those members affected and go over the changes. Great job to the committee for their hard work getting this accomplished.

With full-time need, the company has to do a nationwide posting at Louisville, and it looks like we will be getting 12 transfers to our plant. We look forward to welcoming them to Local 863 very soon. With the transfers coming to our plant there is now only a need to hire maybe 10-12 more TFT's.

The company hired a new Electrician on 9-15-25. I would like to

congratulate and welcome Clayton Vanmeter to Sharonville. In addition to Clayton the company has made some more offers to other electrician candidates. If everything goes well, we will be welcoming more new electricians to Sharonville in the next couple weeks.

I want to congratulate Cody Carpenter for completing his Millwright apprentice program and Felicia Fitzgerald for completing her electrician program. Great job to you both!

Reminder that on Oct. 20 the 3% general wage increase will go into effect for all seniority members. This is great news for us all.

In closing, remember October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month, so do not forget to wear your Pink on Tuesday Oct. 21 as we will be doing our annual Pink Out the Plant Day to show our support. Unfortunately, Tshirts will not be available this year due to them not being able to arrive on time but there will be quite a few gift baskets that have been donated by different areas in the plant to help raise money for the Cure. If anyone is interested in purchasing raffle tickets for the baskets there will be more info out shortly.

Attention ALL: SVS VISION ISSUES

Follow Up on SVS Vision – we have been working closely with SVS headquarters to make sure that the Ford Active and Retiree's are no longer being put on a waiting list for months. I am getting weekly updates from their management team about the new corrective action put in place at the Montgomery Road SVS office. The doctor is currently coming in 3 days a week and prioritizing the UAW/Ford members. They do provide an option for a Virtual Visit there in the office for members under the age of 50. I have not received any recent concerns from our membership about the service since new corrective actions have been put in place. Please do not hesitate to contact the benefit office (513) 782-7626 if you begin to have issues getting scheduled Remember to let them know you are from UAW/Ford so you are prioritized.

Attention Retirees Only:

Remember to contact the UAW MEDICAL BENEFITS TRUST RHCC (866) 637-7555 if you are eligible for Medicare and on the BCBS TCN medical plan and you want to remain on that plan come January 1, 2026, before October 31, 2025, during Open Enrollment. If you fail to call the RHCC they will automatically switch you over to Transmitter Page 4

United Health Care as of January 1, 2026. If you retired in 2025 and are currently on BCBS TCN plan you must call as well if you want to stay on this plan. This does not apply to the non-Medicare folks on BCBS ECP plan.

VERY IMPORTANT FOR RETIREE'S:

Please make sure you are NOT speaking to folks on the phone saying they are from Medicare, or other insurance companies trying to persuade you that they can get you free groceries, free rides to the doctor, more dental care, or other tempting goodies. They want you to switch over to their Medicare plans, which will cause you to lose your UAW TRUST insurance. It is just so easy for them to suck you in without you really understanding what is happening. **BE** ON ALERT, HANG UP THE **PHONE and NEVER GIVE ANY-**ONE YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER OVER THE PHONE.

MEDICARE or Social Security will NEVER just call you out of the blue, any calls from them will be scheduled when you call for an appointment with an actual day and time appointment. So, if someone tells you they are from Medicare or Social Security, and you did not call to schedule an appointment HANG-UP IMMEDIATELY!!

IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

I have mentioned this time and time again, when you are going for Physical Therapy and you have National PPO BCBS plan you MUST go in NETWORK with Theramatrix (see the back of your card). Go to the website to find in network locations at www.theramatrix.com or call the number on the back of your card. You will be paying out of pocket if you go out of network. It is imperative that you stay in network with all your coverages. It is your responsibility to make sure you are going to an IN-NETWORK provider. If you have any doubts, go to the websites,

and verify or call the number of the back of your cards.

The landscape for labor unions in 2025 have seen significant shifts resulting from executive actions and changes in federal enforcement policy, particularly affecting the public sector. The most substantial impact came from Executive Orders issued throughout the year that explicitly ended collective bargaining rights for over one million federal employees across numerous agencies. These actions effectively ended union contracts for nearly 85% of the unionized federal workforce, while halting the ability of these unions to negotiate wages, working conditions, and disciplinary procedures. These are the people in our communities who care for our veterans, deliver Social Security benefits on time, ensure the safety of our food and water, protect us at airports and during national emergencies.

Additionally, while many of these workers are currently furloughed, during the government shutdown, they are being threatened with not receiving pay upon returning to work.

The UAW stands in solidarity with all these federal workers, their families, and every American who depends on the crucial services these workers provide.

Also, the regulatory environment for private sector unions underwent a major policy shift at the National Labor Relations Board. Following the removal of pro-labor appointees early in the year, the NLRB's Acting General Counsel quickly rescinded pro-union directives established by the previous administration. These moves signaled a return to a more employer-friendly stance in federal labor law enforcement, encouraging employers to reassess their union engagement strategies and creating a more challenging environment for union organizing efforts.

As we move into the last part of the year and into 2026, we must demand that our leaders stand up and fight for the WORKING CLASS.
