Vice President's Report by Danny Powers



As I sit here writing this article, both our International and Local contracts are being negotiated.

There is both optimism and apprehension about the outcome of these negotiations. UAW International President Shawn Fain is taking a very direct and hard stance. In one of his social media updates, he states the Big Three (Ford, GM, and Stellantis) have made over \$21 billion in profits in the first half of this year! He also outlined a few of the main demands his team is pushing for. He calls them the Members Demands.

Below is just some of those demands:

- -Eliminate tiers
- -Substantial wage increases
- -Restore COLA
- -Defined benefits and pension for all workers
- -Re-establish Retiree medical benefits
- -Right to strike over plant closures (the Big Three have closed 65 plants over last 20 years)
- -The working Family protection program (If a company closes and pulls out of the community, they must pay workers to perform community service, etc.)
- -End abuse of temps...(temporary workers are just that..temporary!)
- -More paid time off to be with families
- -Significantly increase Retiree pay

Just to put things in perspective, a new worker at Ultium Cells (a joint venture between GM and LG Energy Solution) would have to work full weeks for 16 YEARS to earn what Mary Barra (CEO) at GM makes in ONE WEEK! READ THAT AGAIN! That is unacceptable!

I urge you to make sure your contact information is up to date at our Local and to support our International and Local Bargaining Reps. This could be a very difficult time but we must stick together in solidarity and endure. Remember this is OUR contract, we have the final say!

Financial Secretary Report by Cheryl Holland



As summer comes to an end, so does our UAW Ford Contract. The UAW Ford contract will expire September 14, 2023, at midnight.

A lot of you have had questions as to how a strike works. A strike happens when workers collectively decide to withhold their labor, after authorization from the International. In the UAW, strikes are governed by the UAW Constitution, including Articles 12, 16, and 50 (you can go to www.uaw.org to see the above UAW Constitution articles).

Weekly strike assistance is \$500.00 per week (\$100.00 per day Monday-

Friday). For each days pay from the employer missed due to the strike (Monday-Friday), eligible members shall receive one day's Strike Assistance at the prorated daily amount (\$100.00 per day).

The UAW Strike and Defense Fund covers certain benefits such as medical and prescription drugs. These benefits are either paid directly by the Fund according to the company's current plan or by having the Strike and Defense Fund make COBRA payments to the company plan.

BENEFITS NOT COVERED INCLUDE DENTAL, VISION, HEARING, SICK AND ACCIDENT BENEFITS.

To be eligible for strike pay and benefits, members must be: In good standing, current on dues and initiation fees, on the day before the strike starts. On active payroll at the start of strike. Members laid off, on workers compensation or receiving

sick and accident benefits are not

eligible. Eligible members include temporary employees as well as anyone who is current in their union security obligations such as fee payers or objectors. Member must participate in the strike, picket assignments, strike committee, etc. Strike pay cannot be mailed to you. You must pick up your own benefit on the assigned date from your local union with a valid I.D.

What happens if you cross a picket line: All strike benefits cease immediately, and appropriate action may be taken under the UAW Constitution.

Remember to save and prepare yourself and your family for the possibility that a strike may occur.

We recently held a Sharonville Open House for our Members to bring in their family and friends. The event turned out very nice. A BIG thanks to everyone that volunteered to help make it a success, and a big Thanks to Bobby Ralston and his band for playing some great music for the event. I think everyone enjoyed it.

Currently, we have 1,206 production Members on the rolls, 161 TFT's, and 391 Skilled Trades. Of the 391 Skilled trades, we have 52 apprentices for a grand total of 1758 members. Our volumes remain strong: 10R ASSY-3044/day, 6R140-430/day, 6R80-425/day, and 6F/8F-430/day.

Congratulations to all the recent new hires! Welcome to our 863 Family. Right now, the Company plans on bringing in another 30 on August 28 for the HF55 Program and potentially another 30 around December. If this happens and the 30 get hired, this will allow us to convert more of our TFT's to Seniority Members. We will let everyone affected know when that time comes. The 30 new hires will also generate job postings for the Membership, so be sure to watch the jobs board for that.

As we move closer to the expiration of our contract, there are a lot of uncertainties to come. I can report out that the UAW and Ford Motor Company are currently in National Negotiations, and we are all eager to see how that turns out. Locally, your Bargaining Committee and I have been

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getting the membership's demands ready as we start Local Negotiations. Right now, we all need to be standing together in Solidarity during this important time. The Committee and I will be sure to report out any information that we get around negotiations.

Congratulations to Justin Treftz (Millwright), Son Doung (Electrician), Todd Baker (Welder) for recently completing their Apprenticeship Program. Great Job to you all!

In closing, I hope everyone can enjoy what is left of our summer and be Safe!



The ACT test is required. If the student has not previously taken the ACT, they should sign up to take the ACT test and have their test scores sent to our office by listing our code number 9894. The heat has been off the charts for some of you and I am sure it has been one of those summers you are either staying in the air conditioning or in the water swimming or boating. Either way I hope you have been enjoying your families and friends. As we enter a contract year, we all get a bit nervous of how the negotiations will turn out, I am praying for a good outcome.

Attention Active Employees Only: MetLife Open Enrollment: if you increased your Optional Life or Dependent Life insurance, please make sure the correct deductions are coming out of your check. Just as an extra precaution to make sure your increase took place without issue you should have received a confirmation of coverage in the mail showing your new balances. Of course, the window to increase without a statement of health has passed the deadline, so hopefully everyone that wanted to increase was able to do so, if something does not look right go online at mybenefits.metlife.com or call 1-833-552-3673.

<u>IMPORTANT INFORMATION</u>: SuperMed/MedMutual Health

Care: if you have this insurance and went to the doctor for an injection, cortisone shot, etc. and was charged a \$100 copay this was a MISTAKE that we identified here from our office. MedMutual has admitted this should not have been charged to our members. You will receive an updated Explanation of Benefits from MedMutual showing that the charge has been paid and you are not responsible for the \$100 copay. HOWEVER, it is your responsibility to go back to your provider (doctor)

and ask for a refund. You should have only had to pay the \$30 office copay for the visit in question. Thanks to those members who brought this to my attention so that I could work with the forces up north to get this issue resolved. So, its important to watch your EOB's from MedMutual so you will know when to ask for your refund and you may have to share the EOB with the providers billing department.

Attention Retiree's Only:

Be sure to attend the September Retiree Meeting to get the updates for the 2024 UAW Medical Benefits Trust cost share for your medical plans. I was very happy with the new plan cost for 2024 and I know it will be helpful for so many of our retiree's. So be sure to come to the September meeting to get the good news.

The UAW Medical Benefits Trust mailed out their Trust Connect Newsletter with good information regarding the Nations Benefits OTC Program breech of information. You still have until August 31, 2023, to activate your membership with Experian for the \$1 million protection coverage for the next 24 months. Online at experianidworks.com/ credit > get started > Activation code 9PD8R6QSQW or by calling Experian 1-800-984-8168 > Provide code BO92082. The UAW Legal Services is available to assist anyone that does not feel they can manage this task alone - that number is 1-800-482-7700.

I have mentioned this time and time again, when you are going for Physical Therapy and you have National PPO BCBS plan you MUST go in NETWORK with Theramatrix (see the back of your card) Go to the website to find in network locations at www.theramatrix.com or call the number on the back of your card. You

will be paying out of pocket if you go out of network. It is imperative that you stay in network with all your coverages. It is your responsibility to make sure you are going to an IN-NETWORK provider. If you have any doubts, go to the websites, and verify or call the number of the back of your cards.




