#### **Depression**

#### WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:

#### What is depression?

Depression is a medical condition that causes feelings of sadness or hopelessness that do not go away. Depression may cause you to lose interest in things you used to enjoy. These feelings may interfere with your daily life.

#### What causes or increases my risk for depression?

Depression may be caused by changes in brain chemicals that affect your mood. Your risk for depression may be higher if you have any of the following:

Stressful events such as the death of a loved one, unemployment, childhood trauma, divorce, or domestic abuse

A chronic medical condition such as diabetes, heart disease, or cancer

Parents, siblings, or other family members with a history of depression

Drug or alcohol abuse

#### What are the signs and symptoms of depression?

Appetite changes, or weight gain or loss

Trouble going to sleep or staying asleep, or sleeping too much

Fatigue or lack of energy

Feeling restless, irritable, or withdrawn

Feeling worthless, hopeless, discouraged, or guilty

Trouble concentrating, remembering things, doing daily tasks, or making decisions

Thoughts about hurting or killing yourself

#### How is depression diagnosed?

Your healthcare provider will ask about your symptoms and how long you have had them. He or she will ask if you have any family members with depression. Tell your healthcare provider about any stressful events in your life. He or she may ask about any other health conditions or medicines you take.

#### How is depression treated?

**Therapy** may be used to treat your depression. A therapist will help you learn to cope with your thoughts and feelings. This can be done alone or in a group. It may also be done with family members or a significant other.

Antidepressant medicine may be given to improve or balance your mood. You may need to take this medicine for several weeks before you begin to feel better. Tell your healthcare provider about any side effects or problems you have with your medicine. The type or amount of medicine may need to be changed.

#### How can I manage depression?

- **Get regular physical activity.** Try to exercise for 30 minutes, 3 to 5 days a week. Work with your healthcare provider to develop an exercise plan that you enjoy. Physical activity may improve your symptoms.
- Get enough sleep. Create a routine to help you relax before bed. You can listen to music, read, or do yoga. Try to go to bed and wake up at the same time every day. Sleep is important for emotional health.

Eat a variety of healthy foods from all of the food groups. A healthy meal plan is low in fat, salt, and added sugar. Ask your healthcare provider for more information about a meal plan that is right for you.

We are very fortunate to have the insurance that we do, with the mental health counseling centers there is no fee for an office visit.

The EAP Program has plenty of resources in every county in the state and out of the state to get the help that you or a family member may need.

# **FCA-UAW Apprentice Program**

- Opportunity for FCA employees who are self-motivated and desire to further their careers with FCA
- Provides FCA a means to supply a new generation of highly skilled and highly motivated tradespersons to support FCA's future plans
- To move forward with FCA's future plans, we require a process to identify candidates for the apprentice program

## What is the IRCP?

- IRCP provides a pathway for consideration into an FCA-UAW Apprenticeship opportunity
- A new classroom / online training program designed to identify potential apprentice program candidates
- This certificate program delivers foundational skill sets to employees who are interested in entering an apprenticeship program
- Replaces prior standardized testing

# **Requirements to Participate in IRCP?**

- Must be a full-time seniority FCA employee
- Must be active and on-roll
- Participation in the IRCP is done on employee's own time
- Must complete all IRCP classes at an FCA approved provider

# **IRCP Classroom Training**

- Standardized courses are:
  - IRCP1: Mathematics Shop Arithmetic
  - IRCP2: Drafting Machine Tool Blueprint Reading
  - IRCP3: Trade Related Preparation
- Text book will be made available for purchase through the participating Community Colleges.
  - Text book included in on-line option
- Each course will require a successful completion of a passing score of 75%

# **IRCP Classroom Training**

- Approved Providers are:
  - Macomb Community College
  - Henry Ford College
  - Ivy Tech Community College
  - Owens Community College
  - Rock Valley College
  - On-line Provider (Penn Foster)
- Employee is responsible to contact approved college to enroll and register for IRCP courses
- The Tuition Assistance Plan (TAP) benefit will apply

# Eligibility List

- The submission window will be opened for eligible candidates to be placed on their respective LMA Eligibility List through July 31, 2019
  - All required documents must be submitted by July 31, 2019
- Subsequent submission windows to be determined by the National Apprentice Committee

# Local Apprentice Committee Responsibilities

- Review and process all employee submitted documentation for consideration on the eligibility list
  - Confirm all required documents have been submitted and log employee status on a tracking application log. Date and time stamp documents
  - National Apprentice Committee to provide standardize application log
  - Validate employee met all prerequisite requirements
  - Forward to the National Apprentice Committee (Doug Rice, Paul Caucci, Greg Gomolak and Lamar Harris) copies of all submitted documents for all employees and the application log
- Standardized tracking form will be emailed to Local Apprentice Committee in February 2019

## National Apprentice Committee Responsibilities

- Review and process employee submitted documentation for approval
- Once approved by the National Apprentice Committee:
  - Candidates will be notified by the National Parties
  - Candidates will be placed on the respective labor market's Apprentice Eligibility List consistent with FCA-UAW Apprenticeship Program's established processes
  - Candidates will be ranked in seniority order on their respective LMA Eligibility List for the specific submission window
- Note: Apprentice Eligibility List(s) will be closed out in sequential order prior to moving on to candidates from any of the succeeding windows
